Introduction

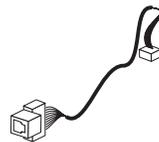
The IBM Netfinity Advanced Systems Management PCI Adapter (ASMA) (hereafter called adapter) provides monitoring and event recording functions for PCI systems when used with Netfinity Manager version 5.20.4 or later.

Installation Requirements

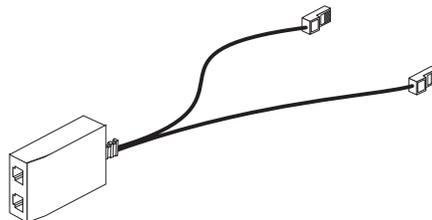
The IBM Netfinity Advanced Systems Management PCI Adapter can be installed only in PCI systems. The adapter is supported by the Advanced System Management service, included with the Netfinity Manager CD-ROM that comes with your option. Refer to the Netfinity Manager documentation for instructions on using your IBM Netfinity Advanced Systems Management PCI Adapter.

This book is intended for a network administrator—that is, the individual responsible for configuring, maintaining, managing, and troubleshooting a Netfinity Server.

Installation Requirements

To install this option, you will need the following:

- Tools to remove your system covers
- Tools to remove expansion slot covers
- The documentation that comes with your server

Handling Static-Sensitive Devices

The IBM Netfinity Advanced Systems Management PCI Adapter is a sensitive electronic device and should be handled with care.

Attention

Static electricity can damage your equipment. Do not take the option out of its static-protective package until the instructions tell you to do so.

When you handle options and other computer components, take these precautions to avoid static electricity damage:

- Limit your movement. Movement can cause static electricity to build up around you.
- Always handle options carefully. Handle adapters by the edges.
- Never touch any exposed circuitry.
- Prevent others from touching the option.
- Before opening the static-protective package containing the option, touch the package to any unpainted metal surface on the system, such as the metal expansion-slot covers, for at least 2 seconds. (The location of the metal expansion-slot covers is shown in the documentation that comes with your system.) Touching an unpainted metal surface reduces the static electricity in the package and in your body.
- When possible, remove the option from the package and install it directly into the system without putting the option down. If you must put the option down, place the static-protective package the option came in on a smooth, level surface and place the option, component side up, on the package. If a static-protective package is not available, use a piece of paper.
- Do not place the option on the system cover or other metal surface.

Installing the Adapter

The adapter installation procedures are described in the following sections.

Before you begin, be sure you have:

Read “Safety Information” on page iv and “Handling Static-Sensitive Devices” on page 2.

To install the adapter, complete the following steps.

1. Ensure that the system power is off and the power cord is unplugged from the electrical outlet.
2. Disconnect all cables and cords from the system.
3. Remove the server cover. If necessary, refer to the documentation that comes with your system for instructions.
4. Determine the PCI slot in which to install the adapter. Refer to the documentation that comes with your system to see if there is any specific PCI slot required or recommended for this adapter.
5. Remove the expansion slot cover for the PCI slot you are going to install the adapter in.
6. If you are going to use a token ring connection, go to “Using a Token Ring Connection” on page 4. Otherwise, install the adapter in the system board PCI slot you have selected. Refer to your system documentation for adapter installation instructions.
7. Reconnect all cables and cords to the system.

Determining your next step

Read the following information to determine which step to perform next.

- If you are going to use a serial connection, go to “Using a Serial Connection” on page 6.
- If you are going to use a Advanced System Management (ASM) Interconnect connection, go to “Using an Advanced System Management Interconnect Connection” on page 7.

Using a Token Ring Connection

If you are going to use a token ring connection, you need to purchase the Advanced System Management Token Ring Connection option.

You will need the following materials to install this option:

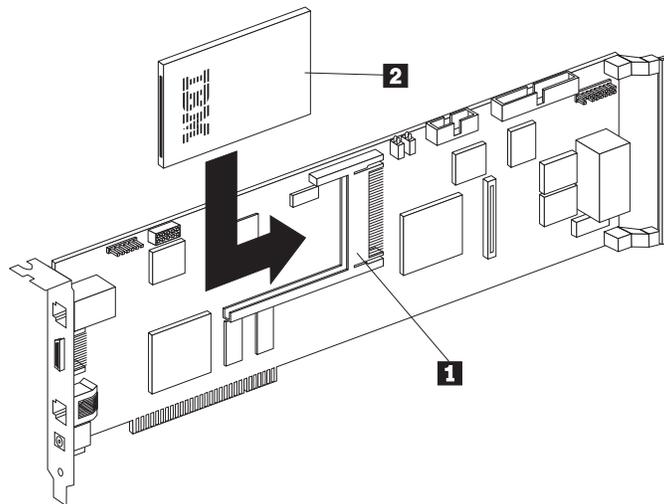
- Small flat-bladed screwdriver
- 5mm or 3/16" nutdriver
- The Server Library that was included with your Netfinity server

Attention

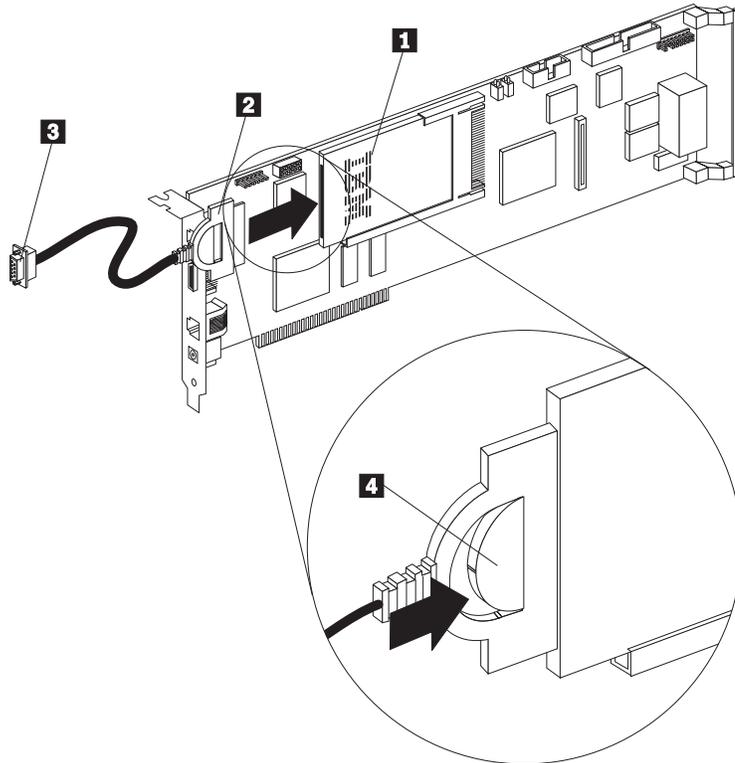
After you have installed the Netfinity Advanced System Management Token Ring Connection, you must not enable or use the Ethernet port that is included on your Advanced System Management PCI Adapter. Enabling the Ethernet port while the IBM Turbo 16/4 Token Ring PCMCIA card is installed on your adapter will cause your system to become unstable. To enable, configure, or use the Ethernet port, you **must** first remove the IBM Turbo 16/4 Token Ring PCMCIA card from your Advanced System Management PCI Adapter.

To install the Advanced System Management Token Ring Connection, do the following:

1. Install the PCMCIA card **2** into the PCMCIA slot on the adapter **1** as shown in the following figure.



2. Connect one end of the token ring cable **2** to the PCMCIA connector on the PCMCIA card **1** as shown in the following figure.



3. Lock the PCMCIA connector by pushing the slide **4** forward as shown.
4. Locate and remove the square external connector knockout on the back panel of your server.

To locate the external connector knockout on the back panel of your server, see the Server Library that was included with your server.

To remove the square external connector knockout, use a flat blade screwdriver to carefully tap the bottom edge of the knockout panel. The knockout will bend toward the interior of the server. After the external connector knockout has bent in slightly, insert the tip of the screwdriver between the edge of the knockout and the back panel of your server and gently pry the knockout off.

Attention

Be careful not to bend the back panel of the server while removing the knockout.

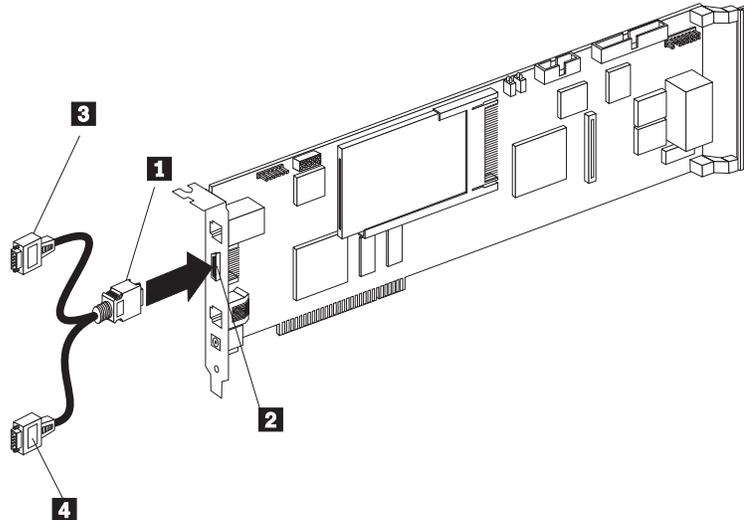
5. Install the adapter in the system board PCI slot you have selected. Refer to your system documentation for adapter installation instructions.
6. Insert the end of the token ring cable **3** into the external connector opening and secure it in place with the included screws.
7. Reconnect all cables and cords to the system.

Go to “Completing the Installation” on page 9 to complete the installation.

Using a Serial Connection

If you are using a serial connection with your adapter, connect the serial cable to the adapter as follows:

1. Connect the serial connector on the serial cable **1** to the serial port on the back of the adapter **2**



2. Connect either of the two serial connectors **3** or **4** to the device you want to connect the adapter to.

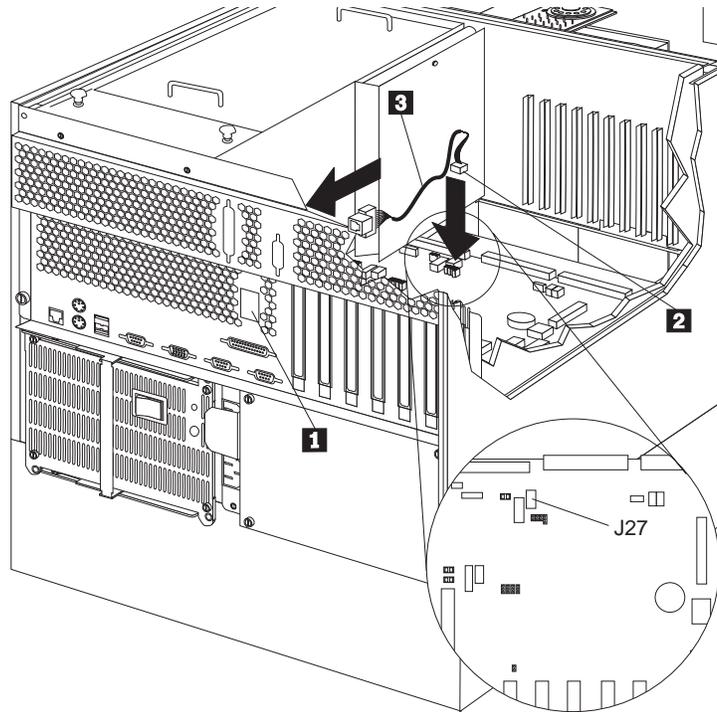
Note: Each of the two serial connectors is labeled to help you determine which connector to use for your particular device. One connector is labeled "MODEM" and the other is labeled "COM_AUX."

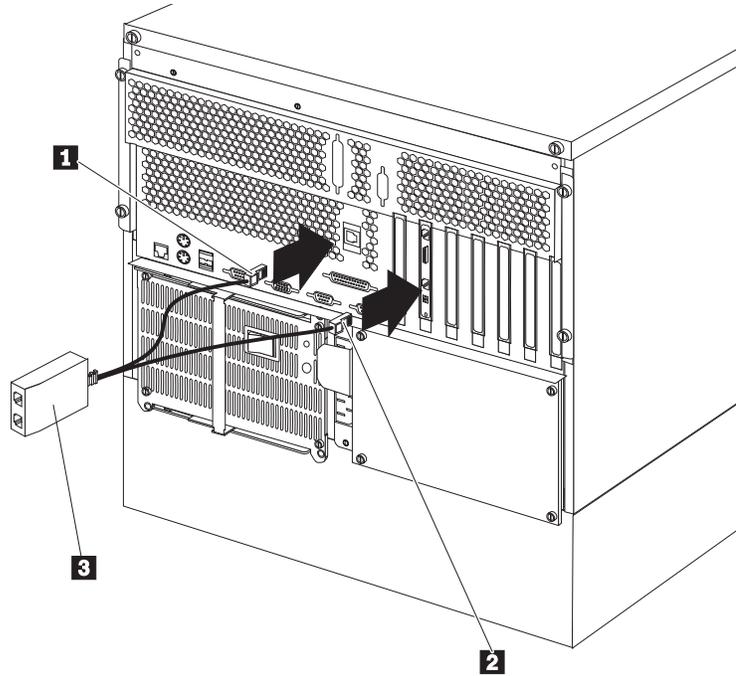
Using an Advanced System Management Interconnect Connection

If you are using a Advanced System Management (ASM) Interconnect connection with your adapter, do the following:

1. Connect the Internal (IBM) Advanced System Management Interconnect cable **3** by connecting one end to the RS-485 connector on the system board **2** and pushing the other end into the knockout slot **1** on the back of the system until it locks into place. Refer to the documentation that comes with your system to determine which knockout to use.



2. Connect the RJ-11 connector on the Advanced System Management Interconnect cable **3** to the connector you just installed in the knockout on the back of the server **1**.
3. Connect the other connector on the Advanced System Management Interconnect cable to the RJ-11 connector on the adapter **2**.

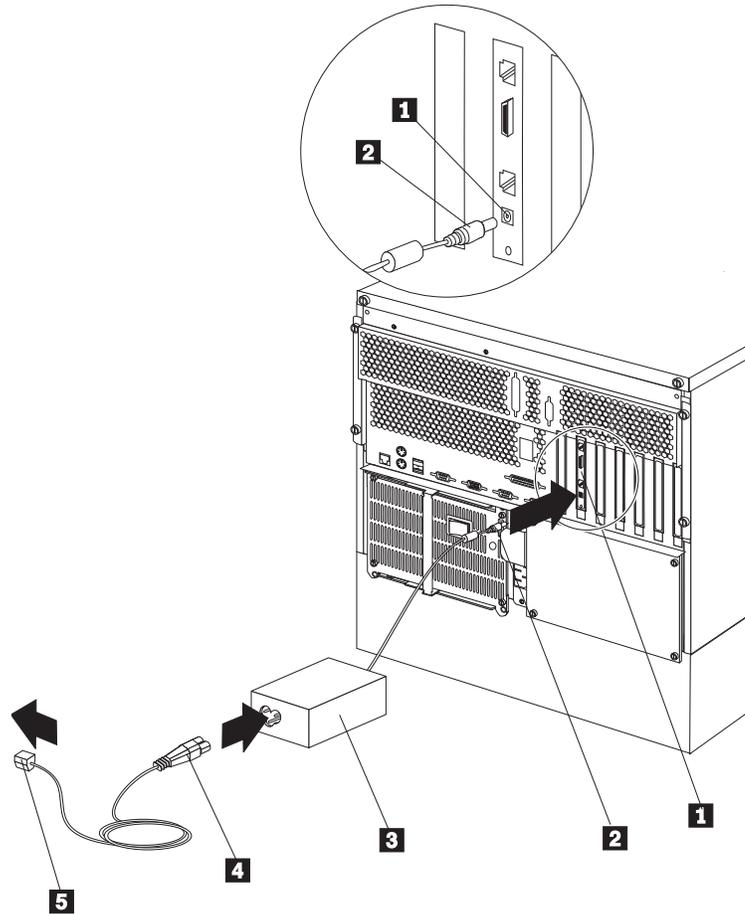

Completing the Installation

To complete the installation of the adapter, do the following:

1. Install the cover back onto your system.
2. Install the power unit adapter **3** by connecting the power unit control cable **2** to the connector on the adapter **1**.



3. Connect the power unit power cord **4** to the connector on the power unit adapter **3**.
4. Connect the system power cord **5** to an electrical outlet.

Configuring the Adapter

To configure the adapter, do the following:

1. Power up the system.
2. Insert the CD-ROM that came with this option into the CD-ROM drive.
Note: Be sure to insert the CD in the CD-ROM drive and close the CD-ROM drive before the server completes POST. If you do not insert the CD and close the CD-ROM drive before POST completes, you must restart the server.
3. Use the arrow keys to select **Update System Management Firmware** from the menu that appears on the screen.
The system performs an Advanced System Management firmware update.
4. When complete, press **Enter** and follow the instructions on the screen to return to the menu.
5. Use the arrow keys to select **Exit Utility** from the menu or press **Esc** to close the configuration utility.
6. Remove the CD-ROM.
7. The system restarts automatically.

Device Driver Installation

The Netfinity Advanced System Management PCI Adapter uses the same device drivers that are used by the Advanced System Management Processor, included with your server. Device drivers for this system management subsystem should have been installed on your server during system setup. If your Advanced System Management Processor is currently working properly, no additional device driver installation should be necessary.

If your Advanced System Management Processor is not functioning properly or you do not have the correct device drivers installed on your system, please use the copy of ServerGuide that is included with your server to install the device drivers or obtain the latest versions of the Advanced System Management Processor device drivers from the IBM support website at

Setting Up and Using Your Advanced System Management Interconnect Network

This chapter includes information on how to configure and connect your system to function within an Advanced System Management (ASM) Interconnect network. Your ASM Interconnect network can include as many as 12 individual ASM connections in a single bus. Once your systems are connected they use the ASM Interconnect network to share Advanced System Management information and resources. By connecting your Advanced System Management Processors and Advanced System Management PCI Adapters to an ASM Interconnect network, you can:

- Connect the Advanced System Management Processors and Advanced System Management PCI Adapters of up to 12 servers to a single ASM Interconnect bus.
- Share Advanced System Management resources, information, and alerts between multiple systems without having to add additional communications hardware or network interface adapters.
- Use an Advanced System Management PCI Adapter that is connected to your ASM Interconnect bus as an Ethernet or Token Ring gateway for your ASM Interconnect bus, enabling all Advanced System Management information generated by servers attached to the ASM Interconnect bus to be forwarded to other systems on your Ethernet or Token Ring network.

Note: To connect your Advanced System Management PCI Adapter to a Token Ring network you must purchase and install the IBM Netfinity Advanced System Management Token Ring Option (PN 36L9654). To purchase this option, please contact your IBM Authorized reseller.

To connect other systems to the ASM Interconnect network bus, you need an Advanced System Management Interconnect Cable Option (PN 03K9309). To purchase this option, please contact your IBM Authorized reseller.

Once you have installed the Advanced System Management Interconnect Cable option on each of the systems that will be connected to the ASM Interconnect network bus, you need to connect the systems together using standard Ethernet cable. When connecting your systems, be aware of the following setup and configuration considerations:

- The ASM Interconnect network must be set up as a bus, not as a ring. Make sure your servers are connected to the ASM Interconnect network in series, with a beginning point and an end point.
- The total length of all Ethernet cables connecting the systems in the ASM Interconnect network should not exceed 300 feet.
- Each Advanced System management PCI Adapter or Advanced System Management Processor that is connected to the ASM Interconnect network bus counts as 1 connection. For example, if you have installed an Advanced System Management PCI Adapter option in a system that has an Advanced System Management Processor, the Processor and the Adapter are connected to each other using an ASM Interconnect connection and each count as a connection on the ASM Interconnect network bus.

Advanced System Management Interconnect Alert Forwarding

Advanced System Management PCI Adapters and Advanced System Management Processors that are connected to an ASM Interconnect network share resources and system management information. This section provides information on how alerts are shared and forwarded in the ASM Interconnect network.

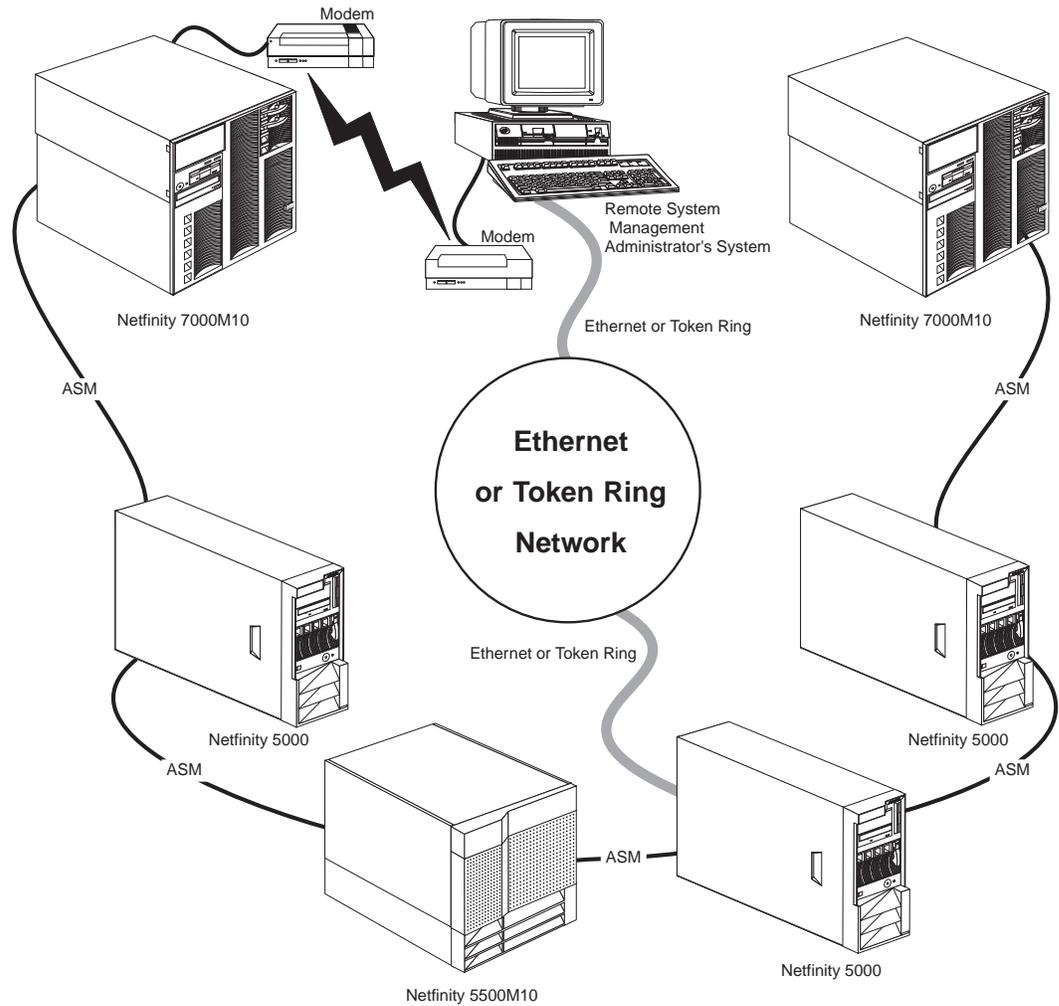
During normal operation, each Advanced System Management Processor or PCI Adapter on the ASM Interconnect network communicates with the other processors and adapters on the network. Processors or adapters that have a modem, Ethernet, or Token Ring connection “tell” the other processors and adapters that these communications resources are available for use by other systems on the ASM Interconnect network. These communications resources can now be used as ASM Interconnect network resources, enabling any Advanced System Management Processor or PCI Adapter on the ASM Interconnect network to send alerts to a modem or an IP address, even if they do not have a modem or network connection physically attached.

As they generate alerts, the alerts are forwarded to the Advanced System Management Processor or PCI Adapter on the ASM Interconnect network that has the communications resources necessary to forward the alert. If no system on the ASM Interconnect network meets the requirements, the alert is not forwarded and is discarded.

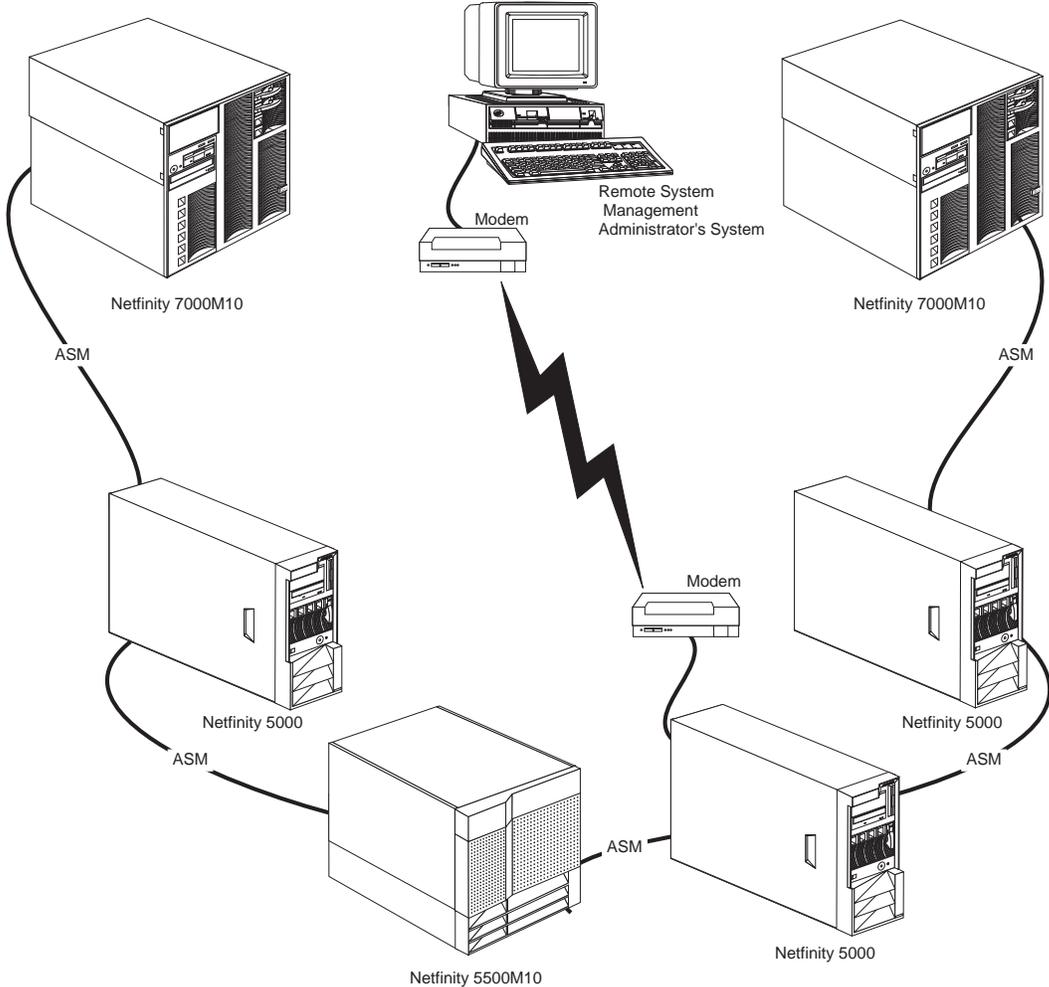
If multiple modems or multiple network connections exist in the ASM Interconnect network, you cannot specify which system will receive an alert or which will use its modem or network connection to forward the alert. If an alert is forwarded to another Advanced System Management Processor or PCI Adapter that is unable to deliver the alert (for example, the modem it is configured to use has failed or the network cannot resolve the destination IP address), the processor or adapter will attempt to forward the alert, to another system on the ASM Interconnect network that has the resources necessary to forward the alert as requested. If another system with the necessary resources is not available or the alert still cannot be forwarded it is discarded.

Sample Advanced System Management Interconnect Configurations

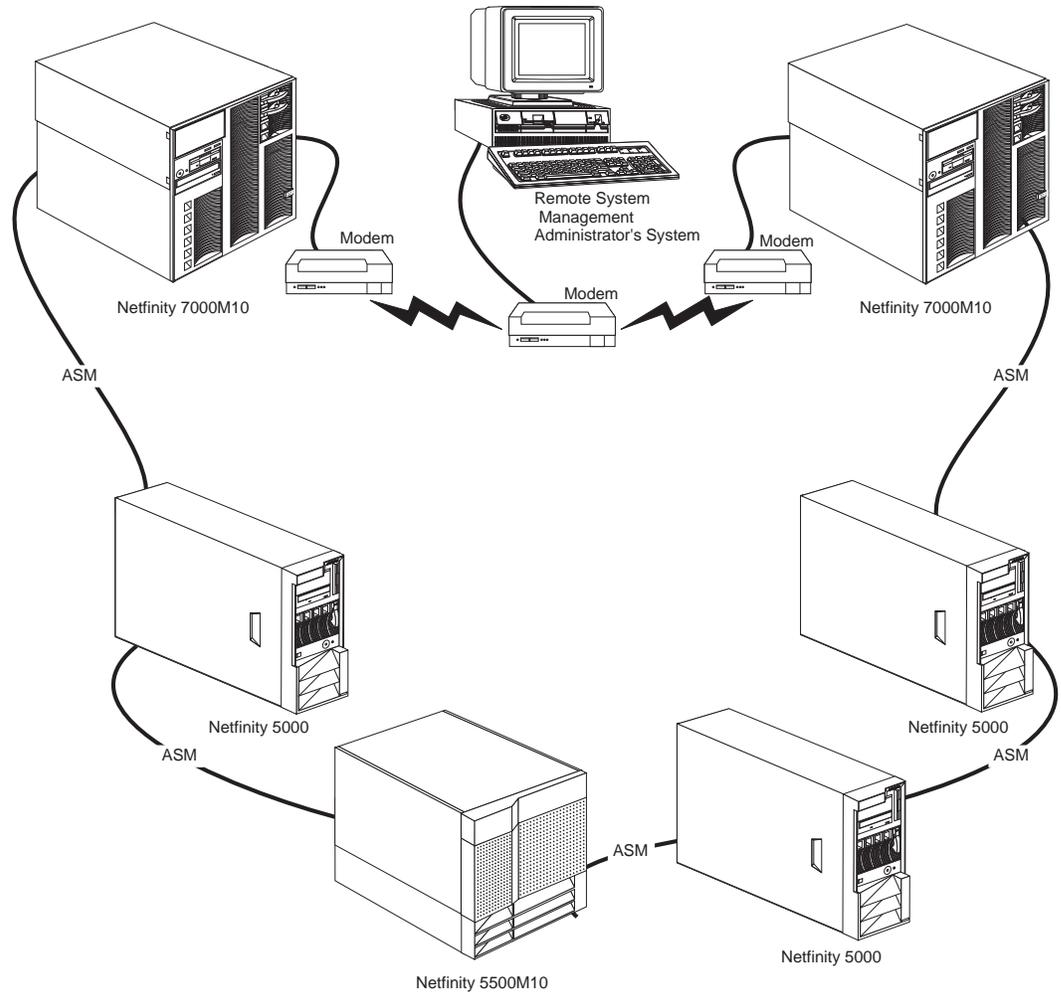
The following illustrations present some sample ASM Interconnect network configurations that you can use. In this example, a modem has been connected to the Advanced System Management PCI Adapter that is included with a Netfinity 7000 M10 and an Advanced System Management PCI Adapter option has been installed in a Netfinity 5000. In this case, the Netfinity 5000 with the Advanced System Management PCI Adapter will act as a network gateway, forwarding system management data generated by the other systems in the ASM Interconnect network bus to system management administration system connected to the network. The Netfinity 7000 M10 has been configured to use a modem forward the system management data to the administrator as well, providing redundancy in case of network failure.



In this example, a modem has been connected to the Advanced System Management Processor in a Netfinity 5000. In this case, the Netfinity 5000 will use the modem to forward system management data generated by the other systems in the ASM Interconnect network bus to the remote system management administrator.

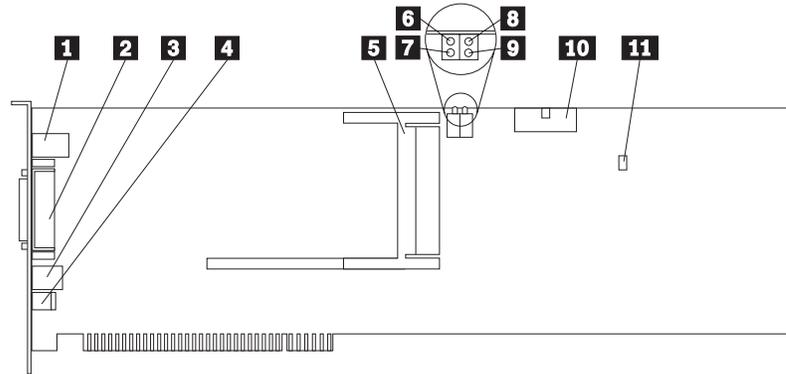


In this example, modems have been connected to the Advanced System Management PCI Adapter that is included with Netfinity 7000 M10 servers at each end of the ASM Interconnect network bus. Placing modems at opposite ends of the ASM Interconnect network bus ensures that if an ASM Interconnect connection in the bus fails all of the systems will still have access to a modem to forward system management data to the remote system administrator.



Appendix A. Advanced System Management PCI Adapter Connectors and LEDs

Refer to the following illustration for information about the connectors and LEDs on the Advanced System Management PCI Adapter.



- 1** 10/100 Ethernet port connector
- 2** Dual serial port connector
- 3** RS-485 bus connector
- 4** External power supply connector
- 5** PCMCIA Token Ring connector
- 6** Power on LED (CR2 bottom). Remains lit if power is being supplied to the adapter.
- 7** Processor error LED (CR2 top). Indicates problems with the Advanced System Management PCI Adapter processor. If lit, your adapter requires service.
- 8** Ethernet activity LED (CR3 bottom). Blinks when Ethernet activity is low, remains steady when activity is high. Does not indicate Token Ring or ASM Interconnect activity.
- 9** Ethernet link LED (CR3 top). If lit, a logic link on the Ethernet hub or network has been established. Does not indicate Token Ring or ASM Interconnect link or activity.
- 10** I/O function card connector
- 11** Reserved J9

Appendix B. Help and Service Information

During the warranty period, you can get toll-free technical support 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, to answer any questions about your adapter.* If you need warranty service, return or exchange is available. In addition, if your IBM options are installed in an IBM computer, you might be entitled to service at your location. Your technical support representative can help you determine the best alternative.

Before calling, please prepare for your call by following these steps.

CAUTION:

To avoid electrical shock, unplug your computer and all attached devices from electrical outlets before performing any troubleshooting procedure.

Step 1: Troubleshooting

You might be able to solve the problem yourself. Before calling IBM, you might want to try the following troubleshooting procedures.

1. Remove and reattach all adapter cables.
2. Remove the adapter.
3. Inspect the adapter for damage.
4. Reinstall the adapter.
5. Place the adapter in a different slot, if possible.
6. Inspect the RJ-11 connectors on the back of the Advanced System Management Adapter. Make sure that all plugs are inserted into the RJ-11 connectors properly.
7. Check the system documentation for instructions about the installation of options. Look for a section about system setup or system configuration. Follow all procedures.
8. After completing these steps, reassemble the system, connect the power cord, and retry the failing operation.

Step 2: Preparing for the Call

To assist the technical support representative, have available as much of the following information as possible:

1. Option name, description, and serial number (if any)
2. Proof of purchase
3. Computer manufacturer, model, serial number, and manual
4. Exact wording of the error message (if any)
5. Description of the problem
6. Hardware and software configuration information for your system

* Response time will vary depending on the number and nature of calls received.

If possible, be at your computer. Your technical support representative might want to walk you through the problem during the call.

IBM Statement of Limited Warranty for United States, Puerto Rico, and Canada (Part 1 - General Terms)

This Statement of Limited Warranty includes Part 1 - General Terms and Part 2 - Country-unique Terms. The terms of Part 2 may replace or modify those of Part 1. The warranties provided by IBM in this Statement of Limited Warranty apply only to Machines you purchase for your use, and not for resale, from IBM or your reseller. The term "Machine" means an IBM machine, its features, conversions, upgrades, elements, or accessories, or any combination of them. The term "Machine" does not include any software programs, whether pre-loaded with the Machine, installed subsequently or otherwise. Unless IBM specifies otherwise, the following warranties apply only in the country where you acquire the Machine. Nothing in this Statement of Warranty affects any statutory rights of consumers that cannot be waived or limited by contract. If you have any questions, contact IBM or your reseller.

Machine - IBM Netfinity Advanced Systems Management PCI Adapter

Warranty Period* - Three Years

**Contact your place of purchase for warranty service information. Some IBM Machines are eligible for On-site warranty service depending on the country where service is performed.*

The IBM Warranty for Machines

IBM warrants that each Machine 1) is free from defects in materials and workmanship and 2) conforms to IBM's Official Published Specifications. The warranty period for a Machine is a specified, fixed period commencing on its Date of Installation. The date on your sales receipt is the Date of Installation, unless IBM or your reseller informs you otherwise.

During the warranty period IBM or your reseller, if approved by IBM to provide warranty service, will provide repair and exchange service for the Machine, without charge, under the type of service designated for the Machine and will manage and install engineering changes that apply to the Machine.

If a Machine does not function as warranted during the warranty period, and IBM or your reseller are unable to either 1) make it do so or 2) replace it with one that is at least functionally equivalent, you may return it to your place of purchase and your money will be refunded. The replacement may not be new, but will be in good working order.

Extent of Warranty

The warranty does not cover the repair or exchange of a Machine resulting from misuse, accident, modification, unsuitable physical or operating environment, improper maintenance by you, or failure caused by a product for which IBM is not responsible. The warranty is voided by removal or alteration of Machine or parts identification labels.
